Holy Week and Easter 2025

During this Diocesan Year of Spiritual Renewal and Wellbeing 2025 it is good to confirm that Bishop Richard is planning to join us for Holy Week and Easter this year. This special year is inspired by the Emmaus story in Luke's Gospel, where the risen Christ walks alongside two disciples in their confusion and doubt, listens to their concerns, and renews them in hope and love. As you may already know Bishop Richard is currently Chair of the Church of England's work on disability, which includes a working group on Mental Health. In 2023, members of that group published 'Struggling with God – Mental Health and Christian Spirituality' by Christopher Cook, John Swinton and Isabelle Hamley. During Lent we continue to explore the themes of mental health and Christian spirituality, wellbeing and resilience. This will then feed into the Bishop's teaching and preaching during his time with us during Holy Week and Easter. *Leadership and Ministry Team.*

APCM 2025. This year's APCM will take place on Sunday 11 May, commencing 11:45 am in church; it will also be facilitated by Zoom. This year we require nominations for:

- * Two churchwardens.
- * Four people to serve 3 years on PCC. One person to serve 2 years on PCC
- * One person to serve 1 year on Deanery Synod

The election of Churchwardens will take place at the Meeting of Parishioners which can be attended by all persons whose names are entered on the Church Electoral Roll, and all persons resident in the parish whose names are entered on a register of local government electors. The election of parochial representatives of the laity to the PCC will take place at the APCM following the Meeting of Parishioners. All paperwork will be disseminated via email, although there will be a small number of paper copies available at the back of the church from Sunday 27 April together with copies of the Parish Annual Reports booklet. All documentation will also be available on the church website.

Please prayerfully consider whether you wish to put your name forward. Being a part of the PCC is an important role and means being part of a team responsible for many things, including promoting the mission of the church within the wider community and the overall wellbeing of church members and the church buildings. Preparation of New Electoral Roll: In 2025 there must be a **complete renewal of the Electoral Roll, not just a revision.** Every person who wishes to have their name entered on the new Roll, whether it is entered on the present Roll or not, **must apply for enrolment.** In this connection, there are paper application forms available at the back of the church from Sunday 16 March through to Sunday 13 April. Please do pick up a form, complete and return to me as Electoral Roll Officer. Alternatively an electronic version can be found on the church website <https://standrewschurchbiggleswade.org.uk/who-are-we/electoral-roll/>. Once you have completed the form, you can either return it to me manually or via email at pccsecretary@standrewschurchbw.org.uk. **All forms must be received by no later than Sunday 20 April.**

The following are the conditions under which you can request inclusion in the Electoral Roll:

Those eligible must have been baptised and be over the age of 16 years

They must live in the parish of Biggleswade. Alternatively, if living outside the parish, should have worshipped at St Andrew's habitually during the past six months.

They must be a member of the Church of England (or of a church in communion with the Church of England) or in good standing with the Church of England.
