The Rt Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally DBE, currently Bishop of London, has been nominated as the next Archbishop of Canterbury. She will be the first woman to hold the office and will be installed at Canterbury Cathedral in March 2026. Bishop Sarah said she approaches this new ministry "with a sense of peace and trust in God". The Diocese of St Albans offers its congratulations and prayers.
