EXPLORING SILENCE

Churches Together in Biggleswade are planning a session on "Exploring Silence", to be led by David Hindle of Guilden Morden Quakers. The plan is to hold this in Biggleswade on the afternoon of Sunday 7 August and we are gathering expressions of interest.
