CollectIvel aims to offer the opportunity for citizens in Mid Beds and further afield to hear top notch musicians perform concerts of high quality; our musician 'CollectIvists' typically have trained at European Conservatoires, play with UK-based professional orchestras and have performed at major concert halls all around the world. In this festival, as well as including local community talent, we will also showcase some extraordinarily talented up-and-coming musicians straight out of conservatoires...Excellent music on your doorstep!

The theme of the festival this year will be around Bach and jazz as musicians and artists get "Bach to normal" after a pandemic-enforced break in their careers! To start this mini Festival, on **Friday 1 July** at 7pm our opening gala concert will involve local choirs and instrumentalists. On **Saturday 2 July**, we will be treated to a fabulous lunch-time concert of organ music on the organ of St Andrew's Church, Biggleswade, by award winning organist William Whitehead followed at 7pm by Bach and the Art of Jazz.

Our final concert, outside the church on **Sunday 3 July**, will be a jazz picnic concert performed by musicians from Kansas Smitty's House Band; a group who describe themselves as 'a group of jazz-addicted twenty-somethings who run their own bar! So bring a rug, chairs and a picnic, and join us for the funfilled festival conclusion...

More in-detail info about the concerts and performers, and how to buy tickets will be available from the 1st week of May - we would ask that you buy tickets in advance, or indicate your wish to attend via the Collectivel website. Covid restrictions have eased but there's still a lot of it around so we will do our best to ensure well ventilated and distanced performance spaces!
