Dear Friends,

It seems like no time at all since we published our Autumn Parish News, celebrated Harvest Thanksgiving and launched our Generous Giving Campaign 2024. With the calendar year of 2024 drawing to a close, a new church year begins with Advent and Christmas soon knocking at the door. That starkness, that preparation, that watching and waiting are some of the many gifts that the season of Advent offers as we make space in our hearts for the true Spirit of Christmas to come.

### **CHRISTMAS GIVING**

Christmas giving takes many forms here at St Andrew's and there are a number of ways that we can give this Advent and Christmas.

### **Rotary Shoe Boxes**

Each year Mary Dominey runs the Rotary Shoe Box appeal and we manage to collect together a huge number of shoe boxes that Rotary distribute to children in Eastern Europe. Shoe Boxes donated by members of the congregation are brought to the Family Service in November and with the additional boxes made up by Mary and her team during the week before, a wall of shoe boxes was assembled at the Chancel steps before the long journey to Eastern Europe. The contribution from St Andrew's totalling 240 boxes this year.

### **Rotary Collection of Coats**

The Biggleswade Rotary Club are again collecting coats, that will be passed on to the homeless. It is amazing just how many coats seem to amass and this is an excellent chance to put them to a good cause. There is a box behind the noticeboard in the foyer.

### **Candles for Ukraine**

The candles that we use in church, as you know, gradually burn down until there is not enough candle to burn correctly. The stubs of the candles then get discarded to a box in a cupboard, seemingly for ever more. Jenny our Sacristan and husband Richard have been collecting these stumps together and they are now being recycled through Sandy Lions Club, to be used in Ukraine. Due to the war, there are many power cuts in Ukraine and families need candles to be able to see at night.

### **Toy Service – Sunday 1st December**

At our Family Service on 1st December we will be collecting toys that will be distributed as Christmas presents, locally through the 'NEED Project'. We would be pleased to receive new toys, that can be sent through to NEED.

### **Christmas Collections**

Across the Christmas period, all loose plate collections are given to charities selected to receive our Christmas Collections. It is also possible to donate to these charities by using the yellow envelopes and marking them 'Christmas' or by using the 'Give' button on the church website. This year's charities will be:-

 The Kings Arms Project in Bedford, which is based in Bedford and is tackling homelessness, displacement and Isolation in Bedford and beyond.  Support for Gaza, In Gaza, people are dying of hunger and disease, as well as injuries caused by the conflict. Food and clean water are desperately scarce. Ninety percent of the population are displaced, and more than 42,000 people have been killed. All your help is greatly appreciated.
